The District encompasses approximately 62 square miles located mostly in rural Allegany County. It is roughly 90 miles southeast of Buffalo, 65 miles south of Rochester, and 45 miles north of the Pennsylvania border. The nearest commercial center is Hornell in Steuben County.

All students must earn a minimum of 24 credits to graduate. *The passing grade for each course is 65.* In addition, all students, in accordance with Board of Education policy, must fulfill a community service graduation requirement of 20 hours of service.

Regents Exam Requirements

All students must pass a minimum of five (5) Regents exams (Math, Science, Global Studies, U.S. History, and English/Language Arts) in order to graduate. The passing grade for each exam is 65 for Regents credit. The Canaseraga Central School Board of Education has adopted, as policy, the 55-64 "low-pass option" for Regents Exams. In these cases, students are awarded a local diploma.

Students pursuing an Advanced Regents diploma must meet all of the above requirements, plus take and pass an additional Math and Science Regents exam, and must take and pass a Regents exam in a Foreign Language.

Special Academic Coursework

Canaseraga offers ACE courses in Economics, Calculus and First Year Experience. These college level courses are taught at Canaseraga by our teaching staff. Students who successfully complete the ACE coursework can earn college credit through Corning Community College.

In addition, we offer English Comprehension, English Literature, Psychology and Sociology college level courses on the Canaseraga campus through Long Distance Learning in conjunction with SUNY Alfred.

Many Canaseraga juniors and seniors take advantage of one- and two-year half day career and technical programs offered through the Greater Southern Tier BOCES center located in Hornell.

Rank in Class

Rank in class shall be determined by using grades earned in grades 9, 10, 11 and the first semester of grade 12. Course grades used to determine rank in class shall fall into the following academic fields: English, social studies, math, science, foreign language or occupational education (business, technology, home and career skills and BOCES). All sequence course grades used to calculate yearly and cumulative averages will be unweighted with the exception of BOCES Career and Technical Education subjects.
